"Tapestry" - initiated by Jan Wood as a Centenary of Federation Project - aimed to honour women of the twentieth century by collecting their life stories. The collection was originally to be finalised in 2001 but has been recognised as such a valuable contribution to the history of Australian women that it is now to be continued indefinitely. Contributions should be original and not previously published. Each story should be up to 3000 words and printed on A4 paper. If contributions are handwritten, please write clearly. Include a photograph or photocopy of a photo if possible.

A fee of \$20 is charged for each story to help with archival costs.
